This decision of the Brazilian Supreme Court sets an important precedent for Brazil's internal practice for withdrawal from treaties. While the decision is a from a national court, it contributes to a broader regional discussion with regard to withdrawal from treaties and democratic participation on international acts, a debate which has also taken place in other national jurisdictions and at the Inter-American Court of Human Rights.

This decision of the African Human Rights Court on Human and People's Rights highlights the courts role in holding corporate corporations accountable for environment and associated human rights violations. This dispute arose out of a highly toxic waste dumped in several sites in Abidjan, Ivory Coast by independent petroleum marketers. This is the first decision that the court has rendered regarding the obligation of states parties in connection with corporate activities.
