Hidden motion:

“Motions to obtain a quorum are treated as privileged motions that take precedence over a motion to *Recess* (20). Such motions are out of order when another has the floor; must be seconded; are not debatable; are amendable (any amendment being undebatable in accordance with the general rule); require a majority vote; and can be reconsidered. Motions to obtain a quorum are similar to a *Call of the House*, which can be ordered in assemblies having the power to compel attendance (see below).
